# From the Vicarage

#### Dear Friends

In recent months you may have seen in St Chad's Church displays of work by pupils of Poulton CE Primary School. These have included work on baptism and the bible, and along with contributions elsewhere in The New Sentinel, provide an important means of reinforcing the link with our Church School.

It was a privilege to play host to the Infant Nativity and the Junior Carol Service in December, and through such occasions, and regular visits for Harvest, Easter and Junior Communion as well as for the RE curriculum, children come to see St Chad's as their church. In return the Church commits to providing school governors, who in addition to providing strategic direction and oversight, have a responsibility for upholding the Christian foundation and ethos of the school. We are currently looking for people to fulfil this role, and if you are interested, or would simply like to know more, I would be delighted to hear from you.

Working in schools takes up a good deal of my time. As well as delivering worship in the three church schools of the benefice each week, there are committees and sub-committees to attend and additional requests to assist with RE topics. I am also a governor at a local secondary school, where we sometimes face the unenviable task of considering the cases of pupils whose misbehaviour leads to

them facing exclusion. I am filled with admiration for the vital role of family support workers, who help children and families overcome the barriers to learning faced by so many young people. I am impressed by the patience and commitment of teaching assistants who work to support children with special educational needs to play a full part in school life. Finally, it is right to celebrate the dedication of all those in the teaching profession who juggle their many roles, imparting knowledge but also keeping children safe and striving to see that they flourish in every way. Teaching remains a calling, in the Christian sense, and a profession that we often undervalue.

On March 2nd we will invite members of the Poulton CE School community to join us for All-Age Worship at 10 00 am in St Chad's Church. This is an opportunity to celebrate the link with our local primary school and all that is good in education. It is also The Feast of St Chad, when we remember our patron saint, who taught by prayerful example and humility of life, as well as through word. His biography "The Life and Spirit of St Chad" attributes to him these words.

"Come Lord. Come down. Come among us." Sing this each day at the dawning and again at the close. Know that God is with you always; the Lord never leaves you. He walks in your darkness and rescues you when you are in danger. Singing this reminds you that you are never alone."

As well as the intellectual gifts of reading writing and mathematics, and the physical and moral flourishing which we seek, I hope the

children of our church schools will grow up with that spiritual sense that we are not alone, and that in Christ we have a companion for the journey who will be with us in good times and in bad. As Christians we follow St Chad in teaching that truth, or as the Collect for St Chad's Day puts it, "Give us grace so to follow his peaceable nature, humble spirit and prayerful life, that we may truly commend to others the faith which we ourselves profess."

May God bless the children and young people of our community and their parents, the community and church schools of the town, and those whom you call to serve within them as teachers, teaching assistants, support staff and governors!


# Confirmation 2025 - Sunday 27th April @ 10 00 am

Ash Wednesday is on March 5th and marks the beginning of Lent. There will be a 7.30 pm Parish Communion at St Chad's in addition to the usual 11.00 am Holy Communion at St Hilda's. At both these services there will be the opportunity to receive the Imposition of Ashes, the traditional sign of penitence and dependence upon God.

On 11th February at 7.30pm a speaker from *North West Blood Bikes Lancs and Lakes* will come and may bring one of the bikes.

They are a group of volunteers and they either:

- Answer calls from the hospitals and dispatch Riders. Or
- Ride motorcycles to collect and deliver urgently needed whole blood, platelets, samples for analysis, medication, patient notes, small medical instruments, donor breast milk, etc. between NHS hospitals without charging the

hospitals. Or

- They simply try to make the public aware of what they do, often by giving talks to groups or standing at events or supermarkets. Donations are always welcome, to help them continue doing what they do.

We received the Bronze Award for the Rise Up against Domestic Abuse Campaign on Tuesday 3rd December at our Corporate Communion when Delia Parker was enrolled.


In Year 4 this last term our RE unit has been learning about David and the Psalms. We started by exploring our own values and discussed which values are important to us and why.





We then explored the story of David and looked at how David became King. We wrote recounts of David's brave battle with Goliath and discussed the idea that we all experience our own 'Goliaths' in our lives and what it means to have the courage to overcome these difficulties.






This led us on to exploring friendship and we discussed what makes a good friend before analysing David and Jonathan's friendship. We decided that Jonathan did the right thing to save David even though this must have been a difficult choice.

Following this, we found out that David had the opportunity to kill Saul when he was in the cave, but because of God's guidance, David didn't do this. We decided as a class that David did the right thing because two wrongs don't make a right and we

explored what this might look like in our own lives. For example: when our sibling hurts us, it can be really hard to not hurt them back but this is not the right thing to do.



We then looked at how David became King and explored the qualities of a good king both in the Old Testament and also in our world today. We decided that a lot of the qualities are the same. Finally, we have used the bible to find some Psalms and thought about what the meaning of these Psalms are.
